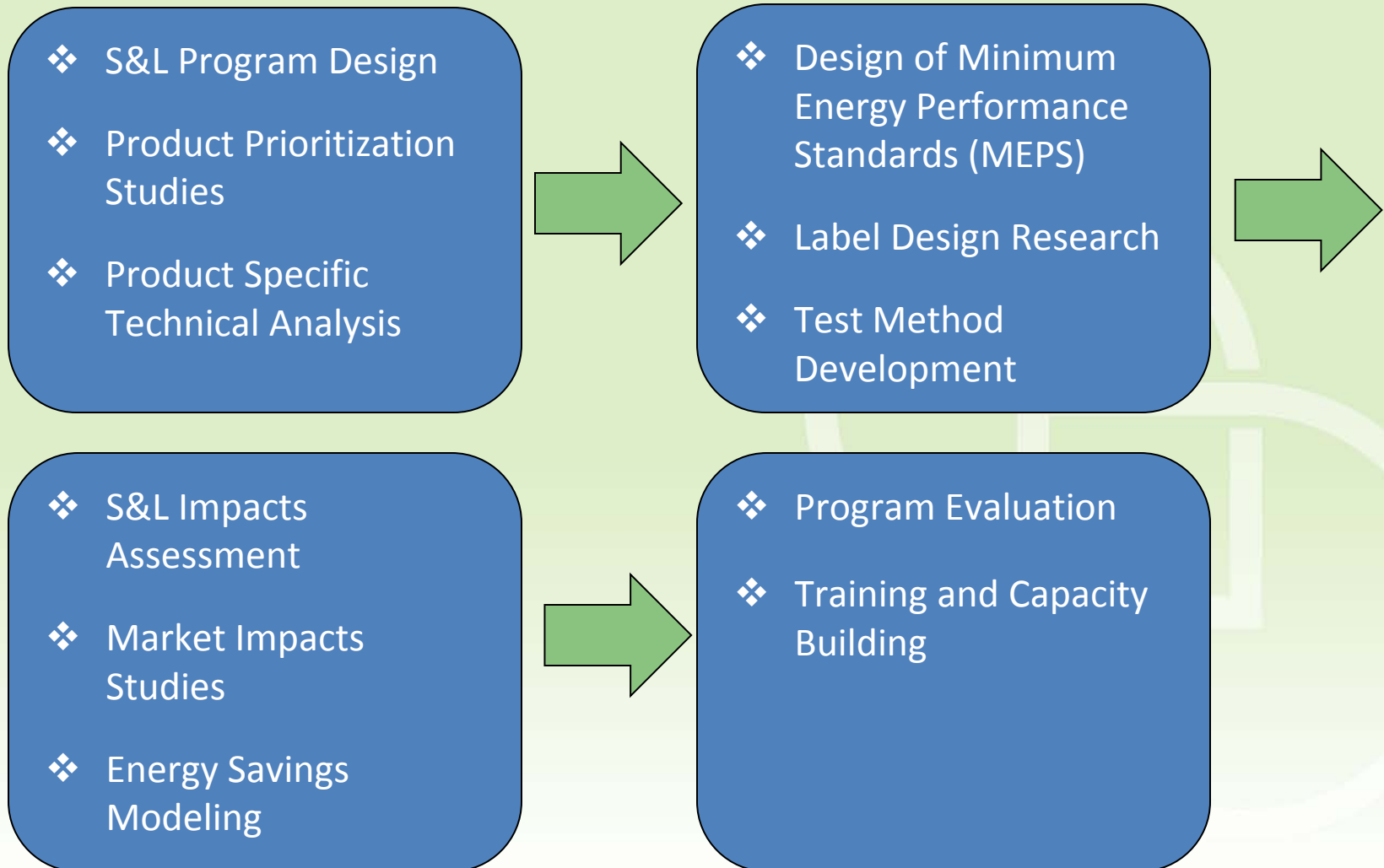




# **Accelerating Energy Efficiency and Market Transformation through Appliance Standards and Labeling (S&L)**

CLASP's primary objective is to provide **technical expertise and assistance** to global standards and labeling practitioners and policymakers to improve **energy efficiency in appliances, lighting, and equipment** worldwide, as well as reduce the emission of greenhouse gases that cause climate change.

CLASP provides national governments and other stakeholders with technical assistance and expertise, including:



## Procurement of Energy Efficient Products

- 1) Establishing procurement thresholds
- 2) Monitoring, Verification, and Enforcement (MV&E) of procurement programs

Procurement programs can utilize endorsement or categorical labels (e.g. ENERGY STAR) to establish thresholds for purchasing energy efficient products

- Utilizing existing endorsement or categorical labeling schemes minimizes the burden on procurement specialists to identify energy efficient products
- Establishing procurement thresholds can result in significant energy savings and reductions in greenhouse gas emissions

CLASP's role in developing procurement thresholds:

- Technical support to labeling schemes
- Conducts global benchmarking analyses for specific products, making it easier for countries without categorical or endorsement labels to identify thresholds for procurement policies

MV&E is critical in ensuring that procurement policies achieve the savings anticipated

- Improving compliance in safeguards organizational investments in procurement programs

CLASP's role in MV&E:

- 2010 Global Survey of MV&E processes across 14 countries to evaluate strengths and weaknesses across 30 standards and labeling programs
- 2012 MV&E Survey to map existing capabilities and resources across the EU member states

Compliance regimes or frameworks are sets of program-specific processes established to check conformity with program requirements.

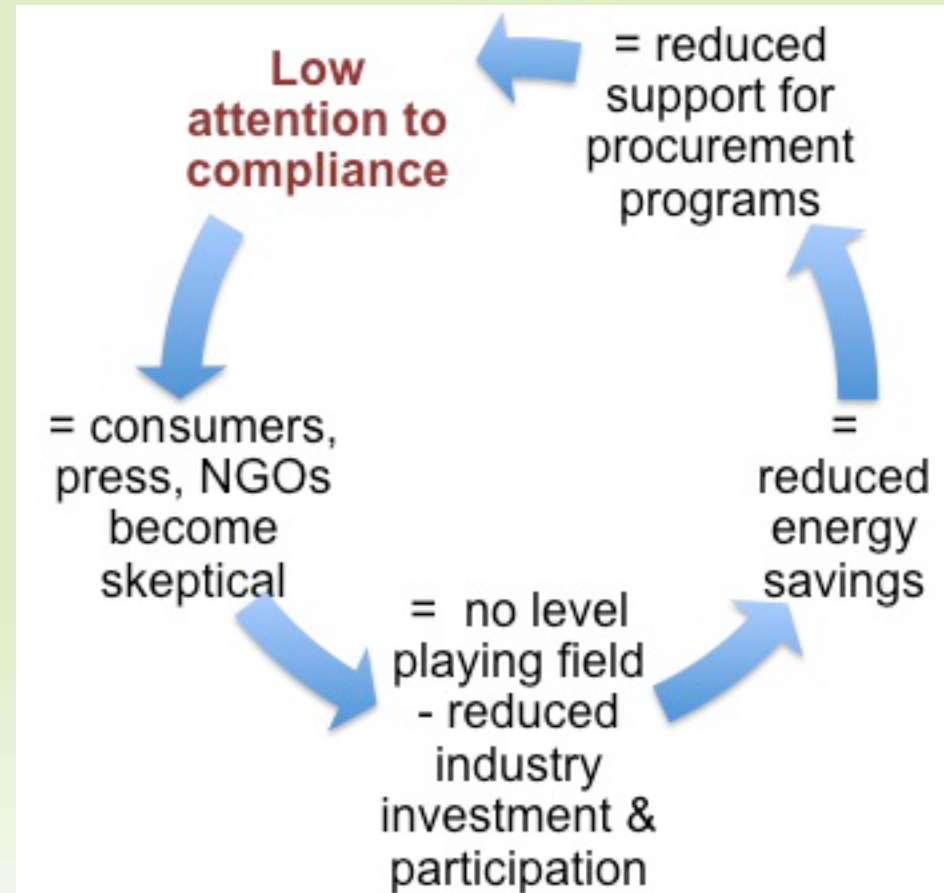
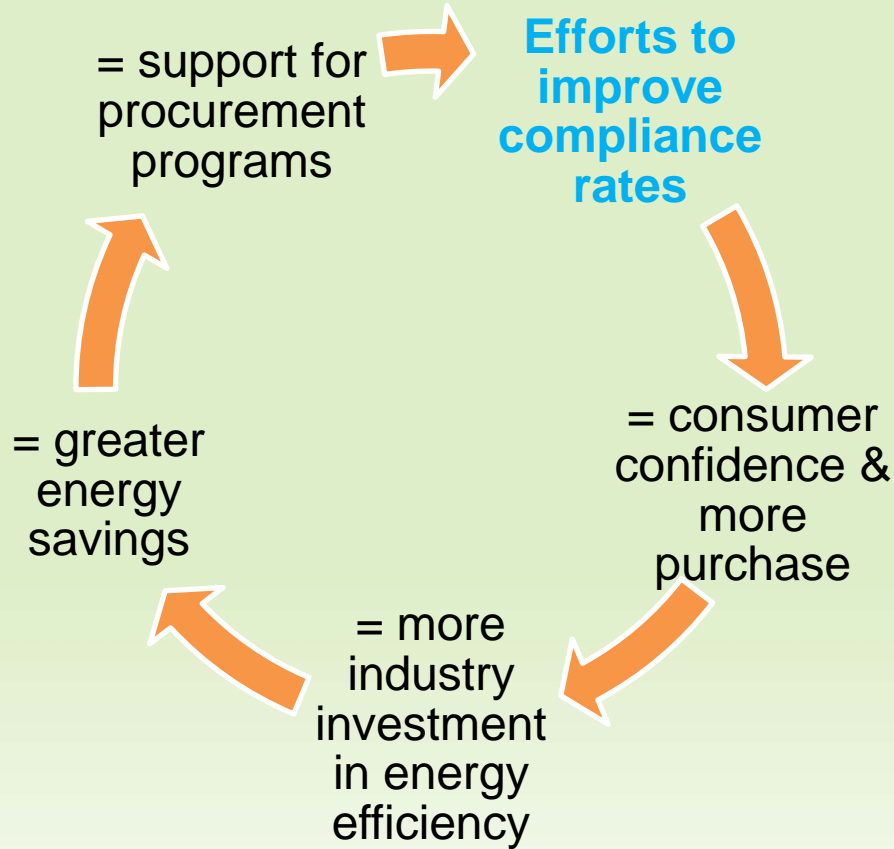
Main elements of a compliance regime:

- 1) Program entry conditions;

- 3) Enforcement
